Art makes a difference

Scottish Contemporary Art Network (SCAN) connects and champions Scotland's contemporary art community. Our 225 members work at the heart of communities from Shetland to the Scottish Borders and from East Lothian to the Western Isles.

SCAN members include Scotland's leading galleries, artists' studios, workshops and production facilities and a highly skilled workforce of artists, art workers and creative thinkers. They sustain a network of free at the point of access, responsive and flexible institutions that anchor local communities and open their doors to their neighbours and visitors alike.

Artists and cultural organisations have been hit hard by the Covid-19 pandemic. Many creative freelancers fell through the net of UK government support schemes like furlough. Organisations which have already experienced increasing precarity through standstill funding and local authority cuts are approaching the cliff edge. But we're still here and we're looking to the future now. We want to nurture a new generation of creative thinkers and support creative business. We are calling for a commitment to keep our galleries free, and for a stable investment in the cultural sector, and in our nation's studios and workshops.

Develop the Scottish Government's procurement framework



Amend relevant guidance and the Scottish Government Sustainable Procurement Strategy to allow artists, creative freelancers and microbusinesses equal access to procurement opportunities including a targeted supplier development programme for this part of the creative sector.

A nationwide investment programme for artists' studios, production and workshop facilities



An investment that includes the repurposing of redundant commercial and retail properties for affordable studios and other cultural provision, as well as stabilising vulnerable facilities and supporting adaptation of premises.

Dedicate 1% of the Scottish Government's total budget to cultural spend with a five-year stabilisation plan for the cultural sector



This will allow cultural organisations to contribute fully to the economic recovery, implement the aims of the Scottish Government's Cultural Strategy, rebuild a cultural workforce based on the principles of fair work, supporting publicly-funded organisations to pay union rates and the living wage.

Conduct a pilot for Universal Basic Income



Our members support the idea of a Universal or Citizens' Basic Income, a move which will benefit wider society as well as artists. We join the calls for Scotland to develop a pilot scheme to put UBI to the test, as part of which the impact on artists and creative freelancers should be measured and evaluated.
